CTE in Ohio

32% of Ohio jobs will require education beyond high school but less than a bachelor's degree by 2031. Career and technical education (CTE) programs prepare students for these jobs in key Ohio industries such as:

- financial services
- military and federal
- automotive
- gene therapy

In 2024, 39% of career and technical education students earned one or more of Ohio's in-demand, industry-recognized credentials.

Many students are already enrolled in CTE in Ohio, developing technical, academic and employability skills and engaging in work-based experiences with industry partners. Ohio had:

141,503 secondary CTE participants (2023-24)	108,521 postsecondary CTE participants (2022-23)
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These youth and adult learners in CTE programs are more engaged, graduate high school at higher rates, earn industry-recognized credentials, and have rewarding and family-sustaining careers.
